MI Familia Hispanica

Make a family tree including at least 10 people and label each person's relationship to you. If it is possible to include pictures for a few people (especially the ones who live with you) your project will be much more interesting when you present it to the class. You may want to research "images of family trees" and use a template you find online.

On a separate piece of paper, write a paragraph **in Spanish** about each family member. Each person's paragraph must include at least one sentence describing what they *look* like using at least 3 descriptive words.

Each person's paragraph should also include a sentence describing their *personality* and one occasion which proved this. (Example: My uncle Ken is very funny. One year at our Christmas party, he dressed up like a clown and scared my grandmother with a huge horn.)

Finally, our class is interested in your family's origin. Include a paragraph telling us about the country or countries of your heritage. If you know your family's history, include an explanation of how your family came to live in our area.

You will write a total of 11 paragraphs in Spanish. You may do this in a word processing program or handwrite it. Spelling and grammar will be graded.

Your project will be presented on or before the day the class takes their Unit 3 FK exam. The anticipated due date is ______.
