

SUBJECT PRONOUNS

A subject pronoun tells who is doing the action.

| Singular | | Plural | |
|--------------|-------|------------------------|---------------|
| I | Yo | We | nosotros (as) |
| You | tú | All of you | Vosotros (as) |
| You (formal) | Usted | All of you (formal) | Ustedes |
| He | él | They (masculine) | ellos |
| She | ella | They (feminine) | ellas |

In Spanish there is a formal and informal way of talking to someone.

| Informal | Tú | Use with <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ a friend ▪ a family member ▪ young person | Vosotros Vosotras | Use with <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ a group of friends ▪ family members ▪ young people |
| Formal | Usted (Ud.) | Use with <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ a stranger ▪ an older person ▪ to show respect | Ustedes (Uds.) | Use with <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ a group of strangers ▪ older people ▪ to show respect to a group of people |
