Oral CMQ #2 – Sixth Grade

1. ¿Cómo eres tú? (*What are you like?*)

- You should have at least **3 sentences**
- You should use words like **también & además**
- Describe your **personality** (use Ser sentences) (**Yo soy...**)
- Describe what you **look like**:
 - ❖ Use a Ser sentence (**Yo soy...**)
 - ❖ Use a Tener sentence to tell things you have like: (**Yo tengo...**)
 - ❖ Hair description
 - ❖ Eye color
 - ❖ Braces, freckles, glasses, etc.

2. ¿Cómo es él / ella? (*What is he / she like?*)

- You should have at least **3 sentences**
- You should use words like **también & además**
- Describe **personality & physical traits**.
- You must have **SER & TENER** sentences.
- **Él / Ella es... or Él / Ella tiene...**

| 5 | Answer is nearly perfect.
The speaker uses as much vocabulary as possible.
Answer is descriptive and in depth.
A native speaker would be impressed with your ability. |
| 4 | Answers question appropriately with minimal minor errors (ie: agreement, articles, word order). The speaker shows knowledge of the vocabulary topic at hand.
Answer given would be easily understood by a native speaker. |
| 3 | Answers question appropriately, but with numerous minor errors.
The speaker's vocabulary is limited.
Answer given would be understood by a native speaker who has experience with language learners. |
| 2 | Incomplete answer.
Does not provide complete sentences; however, the information given does answer the question asked.
Minor errors are so numerous that a native speaker would have great difficulty understanding the answer. |
| 1 | Attempts to answer the question; however, the errors are so numerous that a native speaker would not be able to understand the answer.
Information given still relates to the question asked. |
| 0 | No response is given or the information given does not answer the question that has been asked. |
