In Spanish you \_\_\_\_\_ have 2 verbs in a sentence.

\_\_\_\_\_ verbs may be conjugated as long as they are not back-to-back. These must be separated with commas or words.

- Yo *miro* un DVD y *como* las palomitas.
- Yo *estudio*, *como* la cena, y *me ducho* todas las noches.

When \_\_\_\_\_ verbs are back-to-back, meaning one right after the other, then the \_\_\_\_\_ verb is left in the \_\_\_\_\_ form and is \_\_\_\_\_ conjugated.

- Yo *quiero **mirar*** un DVD.
- Tú ***puedes estudiar*** en casa.
